


## Medication Support

Through a tumultuous year of COVID-19-related challenges and disruptions, I’m proud of the resilience and dedication our team displayed as we came together to mitigate the impact.

Leveraging our mission of “healing all people with compassion, faith and excellence” as our guiding north star, our team set out to tackle the many social and health inequities exposed by the pandemic. Our team excelled in this effort, showing an unbreakable synergy as we pushed forward.

Providing quality healthcare is a pillar of our work and mission. Over this past year, we recognized that addressing social determinants of health outside of direct healthcare services – this includes safe and affordable housing, workforce development, education, access to quality foods and water, as well as drug safety – is tantamount to creating a healthy community.

In response, our team came together to address these social determinants of health through a robust variety of programs and services such as the Ryan White Housing Initiative, student mentoring projects and drug drop-off programs.

This year, we contributed a total of 5.5 percent, or \$63.8 million, of our net operating expenses in community benefit. That figure includes \$31.7 million in charity care and \$1.4 million in community outreach. Teammates donated 3,478 hours of staff time supporting the community and health related initiatives serving 9,972 residents. These statistics make evident our team’s steadfast commitment to healing all people.

I extend a sincere gratitude to our teammates and community partners who work hand in hand to create a healthier, more equitable environment for all tri-county residents.



2021 Community Benefit Report

Total Community Benefit Expense: \$63,815,113 million.  
(5.5% of Net Operating Expenses)

In 2021, Roper St. Francis Healthcare served 9,972 of our neighbors in support of wellness, outreach and education events. Our staff contributed 3,478 hours in community service. We supported 58 organizations with sponsorships, including with Charleston Promise Neighborhood, East Cooper Community Outreach, Tri-County Veterans Support Network, One80 Place, Mental Health Heroes and the Dee Norton Child Advocacy Center.



Ryan White Wellness Center

Bolsters Community Services in 2021

In 2021, the Ryan White Wellness Center launched Roper St. Francis Healthcare’s first fully operational dental clinic.

The new suite has three state-of-the-art dental working spaces and is located with Ryan White’s medical clinic and eyecare clinic. In addition to Ryan White patients, the dental program will be available to under or uninsured patients with head and neck cancer.

The dental clinic is staffed through a collaboration with the MUSC School of Dental Medicine and will become a specialty teaching site for students. Full preventative and restorative dental services will be available on site, and all services will be provided at no cost to those who are unable to pay.

The Ryan White Wellness Center also expanded through a new partnership with Lowcountry Eye Care to provide optometry services to patients. Optometry services launched in 2021 and free to its enrolled patients.

The center has worked hard to co-locate services at its clinic to make access as easy as possible for its patients.
