Roper Hospital Respiratory Therapist Josh Denton has been honored as our annual Acts of Kindness winner for the extraordinary compassion he showed to a dying patient.

The Acts of Kindness Award is sponsored by the volunteer department and honors teammates who have provided an extra measure of compassion and kindness to our patients. Teammates are recognized quarterly when nominated for the award and the annual award winner is picked from

among these wonderful examples of teammates going above and beyond.

Denton was nominated by Selena Anderson, who shared the story of a patient who was in multisystem organ failure and not improving despite aggressive medical therapies.

As the patient continued to decline, the family made her a DNR and started to contemplate withdrawing care. The patient's husband asked Selena if the respiratory therapist was working but unfortunately it was his day off. The husband requested that the respiratory therapist be called and asked to come in to play a song on his ukulele for the patient.

The family proceeded to relate how gentle and caring the respiratory therapist was with the patient and how grateful they were for him. They said they had never seen a healthcare worker care so compassionately.

Selena sent Josh a text message and he responded that he already had plans for the night. Selena told the family that the respiratory therapist had prior engagements and they understood.

Thirty minutes later, the respiratory therapist showed up on his day off to provide emotional support to this dying patient and her family.

He cancelled his plans and came in to play a song on his ukulele for the family and the patient.

The teammate's manager says that he always puts patient care first. This is only one example of the love and happiness this teammate brings to all of his patient's lives, spreading joy everyday while he works.

We congratulate Josh on all his accomplishments, but most of all for demonstrating the mission of Roper St. Francis Healthcare through his Act of Kindness.

RSFH is growing! Berkeley Hospital to expand



State regulators issued the final green light for Roper St. Francis Berkeley Hospital to more than double in size within four years. Utility site work should start in spring of 2023 with groundbreaking of the expansion to occur by Q3. It is anticipated that the project will be completed by then end of 2025.
